- Established in 1990, EnR is a voluntary network of 24 'national' energy agencies with responsibility for planning, management and review of national research, development, demonstration and dissemination programmes;


Monitoring Behaviour Change Measures

17 January > 31 March 2023

16 countries responded (out of 24 EnR)



Awareness campaigns, programmes on advice, behavioural intervention, education, and research projects


