





Youth Energy Council (YEC)

Description Advisory body at national level whose tasks consist of assisting decision makers on the design, implementation and evaluation of policies regarding youth and energy.

Objective To bring together youth from diverse backgrounds to effectively **institutionalise** youth representation in energy related policy making.

Methodology

- Governments establish the rulebook of YECs in consultation with relevant stakeholders.
- **Council members are chosen** bearing in mind geographical and disadvantaged groups representation.
- The activity and impact of the council are monitored by a comprehensive and transparent annual report



Youth national energy survey

Description The Youth National Energy Survey is an initiative to collect data from youth about national and European energy-related issues, including existing energy policy, energy literacy, and energy attitude

Objective Obtain youth opinions on current energy issues at national and European levels regularly and contribute to overcome the lack of youth participation in energy policy making

Methodology This national survey would be conducted every 2 years, online within the budget of Eurostat. Eurostat, a youth committee, and relevant national statistics institutions should cooperate in designing, conduction, and analysing of the survey.



One-stop-shop for youth energy engagement

Description. Create a comprehensive, one-stop-shop platform for youth to access information about educational, vocational training and civic engagement opportunities will encourage the active participation of youth.

Objective encourage the active participation of youth in the energy transition

Methodology The European Energy Network (EnR) will set up a web database that lists opportunities in the energy sector such as: graduate and post-graduate courses, PhDs and grants, events and conferences, summer schools, vocational trainings, internships, NGOs and civic organisations. The database is built using crowdsourced data collection method where energy stakeholders provide entries on their own which are then validated by the respective energy agency.



Label for youth friendly companies, associations and public organisations

Description An annual award labelling system organised by an independent Youth Association.

- Eligible employers in the energy sector will receive an invitation to apply for this label award.
 - Applicants pay a fee used to fund this initiative.
- Meeting minimum criteria: Youth Friendly Employer label
- Highest ranking applicant: Youth Friendly Company of the Year label

Objective Raise awareness, promote and award employers in the energy sector which are working towards increasing youth participation and involvement within their structure.




