

# Who's already on board?

**Lithuania, Malta, Italy, Poland, Slovakia and Luxembourg are the 6 European countries of origin of the 9 organisations collaborating with the Intercept Project.**

A partnership which brings together universities and research and training institutions, analysis and planning institutes, employment promotion agencies.

- **Jobsplus** from Malta is the lead partner who will coordinate the entire project.
- **Visionary Analytics** from Lithuania, **CASE - Center for Social and Economic Research from Poland** and the **Institute of Economic Research - Slovak Academy of Sciences** will oversee the research aspects of the project;
- The **Region of Tuscany, Anci Toscana** and the **Grosseto University Hub** in Italy will focus on communications, outreach and training development;
- **Anci Toscana** with **Jobsplus** and the **Lithuanian Public Employment Service** will pilot the innovative training in green skills which will involve 300 NEETs across the three countries (Lithuania, Malta and Italy);
- As the project expert partner, **ADEM, the National Employment Agency of Luxembourg**, will share knowledge about labour market mechanisms and guidance of young jobseekers.

INTERCEPT project benefits from a € 2.18M grant from Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway through the EEA and Norway Grants Fund for Youth Employment.

# What are the EEA and Norway Grants?

The **EEA and Norway Grants** represent the contribution of **Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway** towards a green, competitive and inclusive Europe.

There are two overall objectives: to reduce the economic and social disparities in Europe, and to strengthen bilateral relations between the donor countries and 15 EU countries in Central and Southern Europe and the Baltics. The three donor countries cooperate closely with the EU through the Agreement on the European Economic Area (EEA). The donors have provided €3.3 billion through consecutive grant schemes between 1994 and 2014.

**For the period 2014-2021, the EEA and Norway Grants amount to €2.8 billion.**

The **priorities** for this period are:

- **#1** Innovation, Research, Education and Competitiveness
- **#2** Social Inclusion, Youth Employment and Poverty Reduction
- **#3** Environment, Energy, Climate Change and Low Carbon Economy
- **#4** Culture, Civil Society, Good Governance and Fundamental Rights
- **#5** Justice and Home Affairs

Eligibility for the Grants mirrors the criteria set for the EU Cohesion Fund aimed at member countries where the Gross National Income (GNI) per inhabitant is less than 90% of the EU average. The EEA and Norway Grants scheme consists of **two financial mechanisms**: the EEA Grants and the Norway Grants. The EEA Grants are jointly financed by Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway, whose contributions are based on their GDP. Norway Grants are financed solely by Norway.

INTERCEPT aims to support 25-29 year-old people who are not in education, employment or training to access job opportunities in the green sector. To do so, the project will select 300 young job-seekers in Italy (provinces of Grosseto and Siena), Malta and Lithuania who will be trained and enrolled in 3-month paid internships in green companies. If you're a young person interested in building a career with a positive impact on the environment or a green company looking for new talents, this project is for you.



## Empowering a green and sustainable future!

Today's **young generation** will undoubtedly be the most affected by **global climate change**. In this context, resorting to investments in a **green economy** can help secure a just and **equitable future** that improves people's lives through the advancement of environmental and social well-being. To ensure that such **transformation is inclusive and sustainable**, policy should create solutions which also increase the participation of vulnerable groups, like young people who are Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEETs). Supporting **NEETs** to gain the necessary skills and work experience to **access jobs in the green sector** is an investment with high potential return and a promising tool for social inclusion.

## What is the Intercept Project?

**INTERCEPT is aimed at unleashing the potential of NEETs aged 25-29 in the green sector.** The project will carry out **research on NEETS and green companies**, identifying needs and opportunities in this area: it will select 300 NEETs in **Italy** (provinces of Grosseto and Siena), **Malta** and **Lithuania**, train and enroll them in **3-month paid internships in green businesses**. This is a pilot experience, so its effectiveness will be tested and evaluated locally. At the end of the project, all the data collected in the 3 local pilots will be used to develop policy recommendations for the European Institutions.
