


News from the EU Commission

New proposal for the Energy Performance of Buildings Directive (EPBD) 15th December 2022

Essential new elements:

- National building renovation plans (next version of the LTRS)
- Instruction of minimum energy performance standards (MEPS)
- ➤ New vision for buildings: zero-emission buildings (mandatory from 2027 and until 2050)
- Introduction of renovation passports
- ("new") Definition of deep renovation
- ➤ Strengthened provisions on energy performance certificates (EPCs) →
- Revision of inspection schemes for technical building systems
- > Strengthened provisions on infrastructure for sustainable mobility



Potential timeframe:

- 2022 to 2023 Discussion and adoption
- 2023 to 1S 2024 Transposition
- > 2S 2024 Into force




Support from the BWG to ADEME's study "Comparative study on the role of EnR Agencies in the implementation of public policies for the building renovation and the main lessons learned"

This project will demonstrate how energy communities, working with energy market stakeholders, can use a range of new/enhanced tools to:

- Promote behaviour change by households and SME businesses towards reduced, flexible and low carbon energy
 use (behaviour change consisting of both investment in and use of energy efficiency and renewable technologies at building
 scale, and more flexible/lower energy use using existing installed technologies);
- Quantify and aggregate energy and carbon impacts of the behaviour change;
- Work with energy market stakeholders to identify how to unlock value from the aggregated behaviour change and test consumer incentives based on that value derivation;
- Unlock new business models for energy communities.
