Work programme

TOPICS

- Monitoring developments regarding Directive 2012/27/EC and its scheduled recast, with emphasis on the assessment (se of effectiveness) of incentives and financing policies for the promotion of energy efficiency towards the targets of 2020 and 2030
- EE measures that are based on local/regional situations and needs and initiatives, including the Covenant of Mayors for Climate and Energy
- Design and impact assessment of policies described in the the EED, e.g. obligations schemes, energy poverty.

ACTIVITIES

- Exchanging of information on the **experiences gained** from putting energy efficiency policies into practice.
- Identification of both **best practices and barriers** in the energy efficiency field in the participating countries
- Formulate brief reports to inform Full/Thinking Group for further actions
- Collaboration with other working groups of EnR
- Collaboration with other networks on energy efficiency
- Evaluate possible applications of new projects to Horizon2020, INTERREG and other European funding programmes

- Co-ordinated the EnR contribution to the EED revision public consultation (November 2015 – January 2016), submitted on 29.01.2016

- Online meeting on 16.06.2016 regarding WG strategy

- Online meeting regarding on 13.11.2017 as regards contribution to EnR Presidency position paper on energy poverty

- Contribution to position paper sent on 30.11 with comments on structure , content and specific input on the role for energy agencies in tackling energy poverty

- Benchmarking of member activities regarding energy efficiency policy (ongoing until the end of February 2018)

- Internal consultation for ToR revision and assessment in February 2018
