It's not only for the money the role of advice services as supporting policy measures in Italy

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Ignoranti quem portum petat nullus suus ventus est

- to tackle energy poverty we need to help households
 - <u>in time of needs;</u>
 - <u>to reduce energy consumption (curtailment and/or retrofitting);</u>
- 60% of the 31 mln houses built before 1973
- 50% of the houses in the colder climate zones (i.e. > 2.000 degree days);
- 20% of Italian HHs say they are unable to keep home adequately warm
- why energy poor HHs do not invest? two likely culprits:
 - problem #1 HHs face <u>borrowing constraints</u>;
 - problem #2 HHs do not internalize the benefits (information asymmetry);

Money for nothing?

- solution to problem #1 (borrowing constraints): "ecobonus"
 - established in 2006;
 - 3.2 million works (360 thousand in 2016, only) with more than 1.112 GWh saved in 2016 only;
- recently, a tool to tackle energy poor households:
 - extension to social housing authorities;
 - possibility to transfer the credit;
 - the creation of a Eco Fund with lower rates (EUR 50 mln)

...I don't care too much for money, money can't buy me love...

- problem #2 : lack of internalization
- energy poor HHs might not want to do the investments because they do not perceive the juice is worth the squeeze (Allcott and Rogers, 2014, Fowlie et al., 2015)
 - failure of "Green deal" in UK;
 - role of EPC color-letter grades (Comerford et al 2018)
- no market for household energy advisors but few NGOs;
- looking forward for the Italian Energy Poverty Observatory
