
Energy poverty as a social priority in the context of a just energy transition





Vulnerable consumers access to just energy transition

- Lack of access to information (complex procedures, language, asimetric info,...)
- Financial barrier (can't access to credit, don't have cash,...)
- Limit to access grants for RES (tax penalty if 2 income-payers)
- Ownership patterns
- Housing conditions (limitations for RES installation)
- Difficulties to participate governance structures






Projects with existing communities (not energy) 2018-2021

Inclusive governance - starting


Self-funded communities: learning from existing non-energy communities and testing with energy savings

Imagine a small box and a group of people who meet regularly to place their savings in it. This box will serve as a common fund for those who need to access to small loans.

These loans could be used to pay a domestic breakdown repair, unexpected bills or a RES installation.

This simple methodology has shown that communities of lowincome people can fund themselves and have access to credit, without any external help.

It already exists in 45 countries and so far more than 30.000.000 people are members of this kind of communities, especially in the African, American and Asian continents.






Participation of vulnerable consumers in public RES installations: scalabilty at EU level






















Participation of vulnerable consumers in public RES installations: suport to municipalities in the engagement of vulnerable consumers on energy communities










Energy communities and energy poverty
